

Basketball vs Atlanta Area School for the Deaf

Our basketball teams recently played our "sister school," the Atlanta Area School for the Deaf (AASD), first at AASD, then this week at home. We didn't win, but both GSD teams continue to show improvement. From Athletic Director Erik Whitworth:

Tuesday 12/12/23 at AASD: We ran into a very fast AASD team. They outran and outhustled us for most of the game. But at times our Lady Tigers showed signs of improvement. By the time we got good and warmed up, we found ourselves already down 14-0. They didn't quit and kept on playing hard. We were led by Ja'Niyah Holmes – 4, Haley Thompson – 2, Kendrilyn Landenberg – 2 and Jordyn Sasser - 2. Also playing hard for the Lady Tigers were Natalie Wimpy, Parris McCrory, Shania Rivers, and Aaliyah Newsom.

The final score: GSD – 10, AASD – 42

Our young men got a little more time to get their legs under them. It was a true cat fight between the Tigers and the Panthers. With good hustle and good teamwork, the Tigers kept the game close. And even cut it to only a 2 point lead by the Panthers. Then AASD threw a man-to-man defense on us and we just didn't handle it well. The young men played their hearts out tonight. And if the ball had of bounced a little in our favor, it would have been a much closer game. The Tigers were led by Shawn Reed – 18, Gary Whitted – 9, Isaiah McGee – 8 and Raybon Zinn – 6.
